Message from Reverend Choi

The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you." (Matthew 28. 5-7)

Dear friends,

This year, Easter seems to come still at a challenging time, with no splendid forecast for the future. Looking around, there seems little room for optimism, rather more concerns, such as uncertainty on economy after Brexit and continuing threats of the terror attacks as we've just seen in Westminster. Around the world, we still face the challenges of on-going battles in the Middle East, and extreme poverty in Africa, let alone the growing threats of nuclear weapons from North Korea.

Then, what does Easter mean to us in this time of uncertainty?

The Easter story is, in a sense, about a small group of people who spread a dangerous rumour, which became their conviction. Although at first even some people in that group wouldn't believe "We have seen the Lord", they all became stronger in believing that the risen Jesus was present with them. And, they were the ordinary people, who were not with much money, not with much power, nor in a high position. But, they did take a risk of believing that their living Lord, the Christ could change the world. And it happened. So, it is a story of good news, good news of hope. And, it comes true to our lives, I believe, when we boldly live out what we have seen and what we have been taught. And, the glorious thing is that we see it start from a small group with a little faith or even doubt.

Individually, or as a group, we may be under pressure of uncertain future, in one way or another. But, I'd like to assure you of the hope Jesus revealed on Easter morning. So, I pray that we may encourage each other to take a risk of hoping a glorious future, shouting aloud "Jesus is risen! He is risen indeed!"

CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 14th - 20th MAY 2017

Christian Aid's theme this year is *Refugees* and the following is just one of the many harrowing stories of families who have lost their homes, possessions and way of life. <u>Nejebar's Story</u>

Nejebar fled Afghanistan with her family after the Taliban threatened to kill her husband, Noor, who was a teacher. It wasn't an idle threat - the Taliban first blinded, then murdered, another member of their family. 'The last days and weeks in Afghanistan were the hardest' says Noor. 'When I went to work, my heart was beating harder. I didn't know if my family were going to be alive when I got back.' When the family arrived at the refugee camp in Greece, they thought they would only stay for 10 days. But they have been there six months now and there is no end in sight. The only protection they have against the wind and rain is their tent. There is no school for their children. Five year old Sudai, their youngest child, is ill but Nejebar and Noor don't know what is wrong with him because they cannot communicate with the camp's doctor, who is

Greek. Nejebar is the rock at the centre of her family, holding them together throughout all this uncertainty. She has even welcomed Faraidoon and Farzad into the family, two brothers who don't know where their parents are or even if they are alive. 'We still have some hope for our children's future,' says Nejebar. 'We only want a peaceful life. We want our children to go to school. The most important thing is our children.'

Our church supports Christian Aid with a very generous donation and also through house-to-house collections, coffee mornings and a bread and cheese lunch so, once again, I am asking for your continued individual support in attending these various events. Here are the dates for your diaries:
