MUSIC IN NEW MALDENSunday 10th March @ 3pmAndrew Roberts (violin)John Irving (fortepiano)Beethoven: 3 Violin Sonatas Op.12

Beethoven's three Violin Sonatas Op.12 offer a fascinating insight into his early development as a composer and virtuoso performer in Vienna.

These three extended works build on the later sonatas of Mozart, treating the two instruments as equal partners in dialogue. In technique and expression, they explore the boundaries of the possible, challenging the physical capabilities of both instrument technology and performers at the end of the eighteenth century. Our concert offers an opportunity to hear these works on the kind of instruments Beethoven envisaged, played with attention to appropriate qualities of Historical Performance Practice.

As always, the concert will last an hour and will be followed by tea and cake. There will be a collection in aid of the British Heart Foundation, and the Music in New Malden expenses fund, which helps to cover the vital running costs of our concerts.
