COFFEE BAR SATURDAY 25TH MAY

Sarah and Julia will be running the coffee bar on Saturday 25th May in aid of Complex Regional Pain Syndrome (CRPS). This is a form of chronic pain that usually affects an arm or a leg which typically develops after an injury, a surgery, a stroke or a heart attack. Sarah's niece suffers with this condition following a serious injury to her wrist in 2013 during her work as a police officer. She has not been able to work since and suffers constant pain and crippling migraines. Complex regional pain syndrome is uncommon, and its cause isn't clearly understood.

CRPS UK is focused on helping people with CRPS to live the best lives they can, aiming to do this by providing a supportive environment in which people can find out about CRPS and get in touch with a community of people who know what they are going through. In addition to promoting awareness and education about CRPS, the charity aims to improve research, diagnosis and treatment.
