There are currently 1200-ish refugees sleeping rough in Calais/Dunkirk. They have no fixed camps to live in as French riot police (CRS) regularly force them to move on, and conditions will only get worse as we move into winter.

Donations are mainly used to provide vital humanitarian assistance to these refugees. When donations can't be used locally they are sent on to other relief charities supporting refugees, for example in Paris, Greece or Lebanon.

-Clothes. Particularly warm/waterproofs for winter, and small men's/unisex clothes.

-Toiletries. Including women's sanitary products, tissue/toilet paper, soap and razors.

-Tents/tent parts (broken is fine).

Sleeping bags.
