## **Message from Karl**

#### Dear Friends.

I cannot quite believe that we have reached this time of year again, and thus that Advent is here, and Christmas will soon be upon us. It feels like 2021 has whizzed by in the blink of an eye! At the time of writing, it is not clear whether we will find ourselves grappling with Covid restrictions being reintroduced, and that lends our celebrations a degree of uncertainty. However, I am hopeful that we will be able to share in the joy of Christ's birth together with at least some of our usual vigour!

Of the various things we do, my favourites are the High Street Sheep Trail and the Christmas Tree Festival. Both of these enable us to be visible in our community in different ways, and both are rather good fun! In these past few months, I have been working with others in the local community, and making new connections in New Malden that I hope will help us shape our ministry and mission in the coming years. When we gather again in the new year, I will share the first fruits of these explorations in worship and through Spotlight.

In this Advent period, we reflect on what it means for God to take on human flesh and share our life. If nothing else, it reveals the value God places on all people, and indeed on everything God has created. In short, matter matters. This in turn has real world implications for how we relate to one another on a daily basis, and how our society is structed and operates. Some of us will express this reality through our service in the Church, and others through our connections in the wider community. Howsoever we do so, it is important that the discipleship that emerges from our Christmas reflections is earthly and grounded – not unlike the God who comes to us.

So, friends, I hope that you will have a fruitful journey through the Advent season, which prepares you to meet with the Love that showed up in our neighbourhood as if for the first time, and to be changed forever in the process. This means taking the time to step off the treadmill of seasonal busyness, and slowing down enough to make time for self-examination and reflection. While Advent is nothing like as sombre as Lent, it is a time which calls for seeing ourselves honestly, warts and all, and being open to the ways God's love leads us to grow and mature as disciples. I also hope that you will have a great deal of fun and joy, and that the activities and services in the Church will be a special part of that for you.

I am hoping, with the help of Stella, to restart the Creative Arts Group in January. This will be held on the third Thursday in each month from 2pm – 4pm.


