#### **Christian Aid Bread & Cheese Lunch**

that we should love our neighbour. Therefore, its starting point is that everyone is equal in the sight of God. As a result, Christian Aid works alongside the most vulnerable and excluded people in the world. It's four core values are dignity, equality, justice and love.

Sometimes we can be a bit cynical about whether our given money actually gets to where it's needed. For each £1 collected for Christian Aid, 85p is used for direct charitable purposes. Of this, 32p supports long-term development projects; 45p is spent on humanitarian emergencies, and 8p on campaigning and education. The remaining 15p is invested in fund raising.

With its focus on Christ's teachings, and its own core values, it's not surprising churches have always been very important to the process of fund raising for this charity.



On the 25th we did our bit in New Malden. We had a wonderful time with lots of chat and laughter as we as enjoying a tasty lunch of bread and cheese. We raised £155 for Christian Aid.

#### Memorial Window for Francis Keith Curas-Thompson

An Update

Thank you to those of you who have spoken to me about my piece in the last Spotlight and particularly those who have made enquiries to establish more information about him, including Doreen Downey, Judy Caddy and Alan Vincent.

A special thanks also to Sue Laycock who is the daughter of Winnie Fry, who was a member for many years of our church community. Win moved down to be near her daughter in Alton, Hampshire in 2021, but sadly died a few weeks later. Sue is on the circulation list for Spotlight and is a keen amateur genealogist.



This is a short update of information that has emerged so far, though there is some additional detail which needs to be checked further. I will do another update of what is proving to be a fascinating detective exercise, probably for the September edition. To date, no evidence has been found of the birth of a Francis Keith Curas-Thompson. However there is a record of the birth in 1929, of a Keith Thompson, whose mother's maiden name was Curas. The birth was registered in Croydon.

In 1952, it was published in the London Gazette that a Keith Thompson had formally changed his name to Keith Francis Curas-Thompson. Perhaps it is reasonable to assume that this might be the person whose stained glass memorial is in the church and that he, or his parents, or members of their extended family did have connections here.

There is a naval record of Keith F Curas-Thompson, a Petty Officer in the Fleet Air Arm and in 1954 he was based at HMS Gamecock in Nottinghamshire. (This was the ship name given to RAF Bramcote and used by flying units of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve from 1947 to 1957). There is an indication in the records that he was a test pilot. On the 6<sup>th</sup> May 1954, Keith died "serving his country" and his death was registered in Newark, Nottinghamshire. He was married to a Marion Clarke and after his death she gave birth to a son.

So, at this stage, we have a plausible explanation of a little of the background of this young man, who tragically died young and the search for more information available through public records will continue. Unfortunately however, we are struggling to find information about the connection of Keith to NMMC and the relatives/friends who decided to perpetuate his memory with this stained glass window. Please do let me know if you can add anything to help shed light on this mystery.

#### **Microsoft Scam Advice**

Beware of fake Microsoft fraud protection emails.

If you have a Hotmail or Microsoft Outlook email account, watch out for fake 'fraud protection' emails that prompt you to log into your account.

These emails claim to be from the Outlook Support Team, are flagged as 'high priority', and state that they come from a 'trusted sender'. The messages inform you that there's been suspicious activity on your account and say you'll need to click a link to log in. If you do so and enter your details, you could end up giving personal information to scammers, potentially compromising your other accounts.

# From May 2023, you will need to show photographic ID in a polling station to be able to vote

### (October 2023 for UK Parliamentary general elections)\*

Everyone voting in person at a polling station will need to show an accepted form of photographic ID to receive their ballot paper. If you do not have an accepted form of ID, you can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate.

You can apply online at **www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate** (you can scan the QR code with your camera), contact Electoral Services for a paper form, or visit our offices at Guildhall, High Street, Kingston KT1 1EU.



\* There are no scheduled elections in Kingston Upon Thames until May 2024.

# Are you ready? FAQs

#### Can I use an expired document as ID?

Expired photo ID documents can be used as long as the photograph still looks like you.

#### Can I bring a photocopy of my ID? No, only original documents can be accepted.

#### Can I use photo ID with a different name





(e.g. because I've got married or changed my name)? No, the name on your ID must be the same name you used to register to vote.

What if I don't have any of the documents on the list? If you don't have, or don't want to use, an accepted form of photo ID, you can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate to use as ID at the polling station.

#### What is a Voter Authority Certificate?

The Voter Authority Certificate is a secure, paper A4 document which will contain your name and photograph. Find out how to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate at **electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID** 



# I vote by proxy at elections – must the person voting on my behalf also show photo ID at the polling station?

Yes, the new rules apply to everyone voting in person at polling stations, including people voting for someone else as proxy. Your proxy will need to show acceptable photo ID or apply for a Voter Authority Certificate.

#### What if I don't want to vote at a polling station?

You can apply to vote by post at **kingston.gov.uk/elections** – a ballot pack will be sent to you by post before polling day.

#### When are the next elections in Kingston?

The next scheduled elections are for the Mayor of London and London Assembly on 2 May 2024.

But... elections can be called at any time. Make sure you're ready. Check you've got the right ID or apply for a Voter Authority Certificate now.
