

Message from Karl

There's a famous line which comes towards the end of the song 'The Sound of Silence' by Simon and Garfunkel that says, "the words of the prophets are written on the subway walls". This has spawned a range of memes that range from the silly, as in the photograph included here, to the deadly serious. Walking around Central London towards the end of February, I saw a piece of graffiti next to a Tube station that said, "true poverty is having all the money in the world and no love for others". Seeing



this stopped me in my tracks and made me think. How true this is in a world in which the richest get even richer and the poorest suffer.

During March, we once again enter the season of Lent, which has traditionally been a time of self-examination and honest reflection as we prepare to come to the foot of the cross of Christ on Good Friday. Like much else in the Christian year, it has become somewhat diluted and does not carry the force it once did, but if we take it seriously, it has the power to be a time of real growth and a resetting of our priorities.

The Gospel reading for the First Sunday of Lent takes us out into the wilderness with Jesus, as he is put to the test by the Satan, understood here as the personification of everything opposed to the goodness of God. This follows on from his being commissioned at his baptism, during which he was proclaimed as God's beloved Son, and represents a vital period of preparation. After all, as we see when reading on in the story of Jesus, he would face a potent mixture of sharp criticism and seductive praise. If he could not master these

things in the arena of his own heart, when God alone was watching, he would stand no chance in public.

Jesus faced a choice between using the power and status afforded to him by virtue of being Israel's longed-for Messiah to do good, or to feather his own nest, to serve others or to set himself up to be served. The perverse sight of world leaders effectively prostrating themselves before Donald Trump and acting as if the naked emperor has clothes is a stark reminder of what happens when power goes unchecked and is abused, as if neither constitutional norms nor international law matter at all. We seem to have lost the ability to tell the truth to power and call out the indefensible, despite what lessons from our history warn us could so easily happen, and the Gospel of Christ has been twisted into a grotesque orange idol about as far from God's love as it is possible to get.

If the words of the prophets do indeed come from the people on the streets, like those Jesus spent most of his time hanging out with even when it brought criticism from those who saw themselves as part of God's in-crowd, what would they say today? I doubt it would be satisfaction at seeing the poorest get shafted and the most vulnerable treated as less than human by the state, whether that is in the USA or the UK, when it comes to the performative cruelty towards migrants seeking a better life here or to those who need help in the form of social security to get by.

This Lent is an opportunity to reorientate ourselves towards the radical love of God, and thus to recommit ourselves to showing in how we live that there is a different way to be, based not on self-interest and grasping for wealth and/or power, but on the self-giving love of the God, who in Christ put his body where is hope is on the cross. May we have the courage to follow him more fully, whether it draws praise or criticism from others, in a world that really needs unsettling grace.

This photograph was taken outside Wesley's by the ramp and below the mosaic and shows that 30 years ago, this month, the redevelopment was underway. The mosaic is one of many changes that have taken place since then. Other additions include the six banners hanging on the pillars in the sanctuary made by members of the congregation to celebrate the millennium. Details of these can be found inside the sanctuary. The red hymn books 'Singing the Faith' were introduced in 2011 and the Revised Standard Version of the Bibles at a similar time. The tiled cross was created and donated by Sarah Choi who designed the image of the church on our mugs, which were introduced as part of the 150th Anniversary

celebrations in 2017. The organ has been renovated and is no longer static. More recently the name Wesley's was introduced at the same time of the 'rebranding'. The Community Larder and tokens for a free drink show that Wesley's is a place of welcome to all.

Upcoming Music at NMMC

If you need any persuading to come to a Tuesday lunchtime concert, perhaps this review of the January concert will do the trick.

Lunchtime Concert 21 January

Two performers playing four instruments with a total of seven keyboards heralded the start of our Spring series of lunchtime concerts. So did a spell of colder weather, a new named storm and further weather warnings. Despite the warnings, there was a reasonable turnout for Alison and Peter Bullett's programme of duets and duos after Peter had told us the subtle difference between the two.

The programme started with a Schubert piano duet, a Rondo in D Major entitled 'Notre amitié est invariable', briefly demonstrated by the crossing of the couple's hands! There followed a selection of three of the fourteen movements of Saint-Saëns' 'Carnival of the Animals'. The clearly synthesised sound of the cuckoo calling from the heart of the wood was the only indication that perhaps spring really was on its way.

We then moved back nearly three centuries to a work by the Welsh composer Thomas Tomkins, 'A Fancy for two to play'. This was a duet on a remarkable pseudo harpsichord, an instrument whose strings are plucked rather than being struck like a piano. The next items were all duets, a Peter Warlock suite of six movements named after dances and organ duets by Samuel Wesley (son of Charles) and J.S. Bach.

Although the programme was only 50 minutes long, it showed Alison and Peter's meticulous preparation with a variety of tunes and styles to suit all tastes. Each item was named on the projection screen and briefly introduced. More concerts are planned for the second Tuesdays in February and March. I am sure they will all be worth attending. Aubrey Allen

Sheep

Every Christmas during the Sheep Trail, people always ask if they can buy a sheep so would you like to knit one to sell at the Christmas Fair?

The pattern that was used before is below and there is quite a lot of cream and white wool in the new storage 'bins' in the photocopying office, so have a



rummage. Let's see how many more different sheep we get from the same pattern!

You will need:

Legs

3 strands of white/cream aran wool 9 mm or 10 mm needles

Body (all in garter stitch)

CO 15. Garter stitch for 2 rows. Increase in every stitch. (30sts) Knit one row. Increase one every 5 stitches. (36sts) Work in garter stitch for 25 rows. Knit two together to end. Cast off.

Head

CO 20. K 4 rows. Increase into every stitch. (40sts) K 4 rows. Change to black/grey wool. Purl one row. *K2, k2tog* to end. Purl *k1, k2tog* to end. Purl *k2tog* Thread yarn through remaining stitches. In black CO 10. Work 6 rows in stocking stitch. *k2tog* to end. Thread yarn through remaining stitches.

Ears

In black CO 4. Cast off.

Assembly

Sew the body of the sheep. Keep the neck end open. Sew up the side of the head, leaving the neck open. Stuff both body and head and sew the head straight on to the body. Do the same with the legs, then sew on the ears and stitch on a cute face! Use stick-on googly eyes, buttons or felt for the eyes. Make a small pompom for the tail (optional). Create whatever kind of tail you like.
